Who: For **Pastors & Commissioned Pastors**.

What: Reading and Conversation of Eugene H. Peterson's book, The Pastor ~ A Memoir.

In this weekly gathering, we will read out loud from the chapters of this book. We will take time to recall, reflect and share some of our own faith journey and experiences of being a pastor. We will share what works best, current challenges, also keeping in mind pastors of smaller congregations during these ever-changing times. For those interested,

this might even be a chance to jot down some notes for your own memoir.

When: Each Tuesday from 10:30 to 11:30 AM. Come once a week, come once a month, come

when you want, when you can... this is for you. Next gathering on 12/9/25.

For those who would like to break bread and enjoy a bit more table conversation, this

time we'll start with the food and end with the gathering.

There is still the possibility of satellite versions in other locations (Hilton Head area,

Moncks Corner / Orangeburg area, downtown Charleston area, and others).

How: Obtain a copy of **The Pastor ~ A Memoir**, Eugene H. Peterson.

It is recommended that each person have their own book in whatever version they prefer, but because we will be reading the material out loud, it is possible to attend a time or two without a book (Achim will keep a couple on hand for following along. Also, if you

attend at least three sessions, the book is yours thanks to a donation provided).

Why: As we make our way along this journey of being a pastor, we find that even though we

are working with people all the time, it sometimes is a very lonely journey. Because of the confidences required and each situation being unique, and because our primary strength & guidance comes from God, some of the "how to" program models of being a pastor simply do not provide the relational resource we gain by our being in a meaningful quality relationship with God and each other. Most importantly, this will

be a rest along the way of the journey... "every step an arrival."
